## **Huntsman Lake Dam Rehabilitation Project**

LFCA received the following update from Dipmani Kumar, Project Manager. Schnabel Engineering is completing the design under contract to Fairfax County. A preliminary design submittal has been made and (Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and County staff have provided comments on the design. Schnabel is responding to the comments and incorporating them in the final design which is due by May 30. The County has also initiated the acquisition of easements that will be required for this project as well as preliminary work for permits that will be required. The County plans to hold a public meeting sometime in April to obtain input on the design.

Based on the current schedule, construction was expected to start in the early fall of 2012. However, NRCS has just learned that funding for the federal cost-share of the project was not received this fiscal year. This may delay the project by a few months. There will be more information on the schedule at the public meeting.

## **Architecture Review Committee**

If you are planning to add an addition or change the exterior of your house, see the web site for restrictions, form and contact person (Al Brooks). Remember, the Lake Forest Community Association Architectural Standards states that detached sheds are not allowed and fences must be no more than 4 ½ feet tall.

#### **Smoke Detectors**

We have been reminded each year, or even twice a year (usually when we move the clocks ahead or back), to put new batteries in our smoke detectors. Most of us understand and do check them for battery life by listening for a noisy bleat when we push the test button. But, did you know that we should be replacing the smoke detectors at least every 10 years? I discovered this when I bought several earlier this year. In the print – fine print for many of us – I read that smoke detectors need to be replaced about every ten years. Considering we live in a neighborhood that is over 30 years old that means some of our smoke detectors should be replaced as either they might have lost some of their sensitivity or they deplete the batteries too quickly. # **Fire Safety Notice - Additional Information**

As a general fire safety matter, it is advisable to install smoke detectors in all levels of your home and change batteries annually. If you have a smoke detector at the top of the stairs on the second level that is wired to the house you may wish to replace it as these older smoke detectors are not as sensitive as today's models. Also, some houses built in the community may still have the original, Federal Pacific circuit breaker. LFCA recommends that residents with this model box contact a licensed electrician to inspect their circuit box to determine if it meets current code requirements. In addition, the fire department recommends that all households plan both an emergency escape route and an alternate escape route from the home to be used in case of fire. These simple measures can help ensure the safety of your home.

# **Community Parking Districts (CPD)**

In 2011 the following parking restriction was approved for the Springfield District.

Community Parking Districts (CPD), which covers our district, prohibit the parking of watercraft, motor homes, campers, trailers, vehicles greater than or equal to 3 axles, vehicles with a GVWR greater than or equal to 12,000 lbs., and vehicles transporting greater than or equal to 16 passengers (except school buses) on public streets in residentially zoned areas. Vehicles parked in violation are subject to a \$75 fine for each violation and may be towed at the owner's expense. Maps of existing CPDs are posted on the CPD maps page. #### **Trees**

We've had a lot of trees come down on homeowner property and common property. Be aware of leaning trees on your property and report any on common property. If the tree(s) are on common property, the HOA will assess it and cut it down if deemed a hazard. If the tree is on common property, and you cut it down before we've had a chance to do it, it's at your expense. Contact Dan Kolcun of any common area tree problems.

#### **Paths**

In the spring, we will be checking the paths for repairing and/or asphalting. If you are near a path and notice a particularly hazardous place, let us know. Also, it would be very helpful, if homeowners who have a path next to or near their home to sweep leaves or cut back any ivy or grasses that are infringing on the path.

## **AAA Trash and Recycling**

The HOA has had an agreement with AAA for a rate of \$69 a quarter. We anticipate a change in the rate but don't know what that will be as yet. We should be receiving more information on this soon.

# **Common Property Maintenance**

Our contractor, Premium Lawn and Landscape, will continue to maintain our common property including the areas around the signs at the entrances of our neighborhood.
